

1 – WHERE DO I START?



- Give us a call at (410) 996-5295 & ask for Transit.
- Tell us where you are and where you want to go.
- You will receive personalized trip information including the bus routes you will need to use and the times they operate.
- Or print a schedule from our website under Perryville or Glasgow bus schedule.
- Schedules are also available at our office (200 Chesapeake Blvd., Elkton, MD) or at many of our bus stop locations.
- If you are not near one of our bus stops, ask our transit personnel to find the bus stop closest to you.
- Riders must be visible at bus stops. Bus stop signs mark each designated stop along our routes. Stand **IN CLEAR VIEW** and indicate that you wish to board.
- The bus has a 10 minute grace period. It's a good idea to arrive at the bus stops 10 minutes early. The bus could also arrive 10 minutes late due to weather, traffic conditions and mechanical difficulties.

2 – BOARDING THE BUS



- Do not board the bus until all passengers leaving have exited.
- Have your cash fare or bus pass ready **BEFORE** you board the bus.
- As you board you will notice a fare box. If you are paying with cash place **EXACT CHANGE ONLY** in the box.
- We accept coins and dollar bills. We only accept pennies if they are rolled.
- If you would like to purchase a bus pass ask the driver before paying your fare. ***Reduced fare pass is available only through an appointment with a SSCT Certifying Agent.***
- The seats at the front of the bus are reserved for elderly and disabled riders, so please observe this rule when boarding.

Our drivers put riders' safety and security first. They are courteous and ready to answer any questions about "The Bus" & the schedule.

Children under 46" ride free only when accompanied by a fare paying adult. No more than 2 "Free" children per fare paying adult. Otherwise, regular fare applies.

**Current ride Free with the purchase of a bus pass.*

3 – RIDING THE BUS



- Let the driver know what stop you want when boarding.
- Be aware of where the bus is on the route.
- Pay attention to landmarks around your stop so you do not miss your destination.
- Make sure to listen to any announcements that the driver gives.
- Alert the driver in the event that you would like to get off at a “call” in stop or a “request upon boarding” stop.
- Wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before departing the bus.

4 – USING THE WHEELCHAIR LIFT



- Wait for the lift to be lowered. The driver will tell you when the lift is ready for you to board. If you need assistance boarding the lift please notify the driver.
- Once on the bus, pay your fare and proceed to the area designated for wheelchairs. The driver will secure the wheelchair using the restraint system.
- If you are using a scooter you must be able to transfer into the bus seat. All wheelchairs must be secured in the bus, even if the customer transfers to a regular seat.
- Tell the driver what stop you want when you board the bus.
- Wait for the bus to come to a complete stop and for the driver to release all safety devices; then board the lift.
