1. Barnes Inheritance - mid-19th century home with enormous stone walls
2. Big Elk Chapel - 1877 tin walled, tin roof church with wooden shutters and handmade pews
3. Brick House - general store used as seat of court during War of 1812
4. Brown Farm - settled in 1701 as part of Nottingham Lots
5. Cherry Hill UMC - the church, parsonage and cemetery all date from the late 1800s.
6. Clendenin-Freeman Farm - Home to same family since 1870s
7. Elk Forge Bed & Breakfast - grist mill ground corn for the Continental Army
8. England Family Farm - 1739 farm impacted by MD-PA border disputes
9. Gulpin Falls Covered Bridge - wooden covered bridge with Burr trusses from 1860.
10. Haviland House - 1913 built, Dutch colonial revival style home
11. Lowe House - Home of Rock Springs post master, 1830-1838 & 1880-1908
12. McKinney Family Cemetery - established 1811, over seven generations of family are interred here.
13. Octoraro Mansion - built in 1750s, home to Revolutionary War patriot Elishu Hall
14. Onion Bed - 18th century Quaker plantation home with cooper's shop & granary.
15. Rehert Center - 200 year old farmstead with family cemetery
16. Reynolds, Edward & Mary - 1864 home of Colora's first post master.
17. St. Patrick's Chapel - second oldest Roman Catholic church (1819) in County.
18. Thomas Richards House - 18th century farmhouse of William Penn's physician
19. Thomas Scott's Place - part of the Nottingham lots, has colonial era kitchen
20. Upper Wickwire - 1857 example of Italiniate style architecture
21. Wherry-Jordan-Logan-Schwer House - built in 1750 by family of Revolutionary War soldier David Wherry
22. Wilson Tenant House - 1840 home with unique Egyptian molding.
23. Winter Brown House - two story frame home from 1858.
24. Yacht Elf - designed and built by George Lawley for 1888 racing season.
25. Brick House II - Civil war era rectory for St. Mary Anne's Episcopal Church.
26. Bristoll - 1750s tobacco farm that contains a sycamore tree dating to 1578.
27. Isaac England House - Georgian period home with facades laid in Flemish bond.
28. Town Point School No. 4 - one room schoolhouse built in 1877.
29. Kieffer Brick House - built in 1760, served as crop & dairy farm until 1962
30. Hebrons Gift - the original house and tanyard date to 1739.
31. Cross Keys Tavern - stagecoach tavern dating to early colonial period.
