Amendment – Zoning Ordinance – Floodplain District

W	HEREAS, Article 25A of the Annotated Code of Maryland empowers the County to have a zoning
ordinance	e and provides for the administration, enforcement, and amendment of same; and

WHEREAS, the Maryland Department of the Environment requires the floodplain district standards 3 in said ordinance to meet the minimum standards prescribed by the Maryland Model Floodplain 4 5

Management Ordinance; and

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WHEREAS, an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance has been proposed and on April 15, 2013_the Planning Commission recommended approval of thee proposed amendment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the County Council of Cecil County, Maryland, that 9

the proposed amendments to Article II, Part II, Zoning Maps and Article XI, Part III Floodplain

11 District of the Zoning Ordinance are hereby adopted as follows:

12 Section 16. Official Floodplain Maps

- 2. The delineation of the Floodplain District may be revised, amended, and modified by the County Council in compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program and the [Maryland Department of Natural Resources] MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT when:
 - a. There are changes through natural or other causes;
 - b. Changes are indicated by future detailed hydrologic and hydraulic studies;
- c. All such changes to the delineation of the District shall be subject to the review and approval of the Federal Insurance Administrator.

20 Section 224. General Provisions and Purpose

- 21 1. No changes.
- 22 2. Cecil County, by resolution, agreed to meet the requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program and [has been] WAS accepted for participation in the program ON APRIL 4, 1983. As of that date [of 23 acceptance], OR AS OF APRIL 4, 1983, THE INITIAL EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE CECIL COUNTY FLOOD 24 25 INSURANCE RATE MAP, all development and new construction as defined herein, shall comply with 26 these regulations.
- 3. The Maryland General Assembly, in Article 25A, Section 5(x), General Development Regulations AND 27 ZONING (Annotated Code of Maryland), has established as policy of the State that the orderly 28 29 development and use of land and structures requires comprehensive regulation through the implementation of planning and zoning control, and that planning and zoning controls shall be 30

implemented by the County in order to, among other purposes, secure the public safety, promote health

- and general welfare, and promote the conservation of natural resources.

Section 225. Applicability and Basis for Establishing Special Flood Hazard Areas and Base Flood Elevations

- 1. These regulations shall apply to all special flood hazard areas within Cecil County and identified herein.
 - (A) For the purposes of this Part, [the following] THE MINIMUM BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD AREAS AND BASE FLOOD ELEVATIONS IS THE FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY FOR CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND AND INCORPORATED AREAS DATED JULY 8, 2013, OR THE MOST RECENT REVISION THEREOF, AND THE ACCOMPANYING FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAPS AND ALL SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS AND REVISIONS TO THE FIRMS. THE FIS AND FIRMS are retained on file and available to the public at the Cecil County Office of Planning and Zoning, County Administration Building, Suite 2300, 200 Chesapeake Boulevard, Elkton, Maryland 21921. [, are adopted by reference as a part of this Ordinance, and serve as the minimum basis for establishing special flood hazard areas and base flood elevations:
 - (1) Flood Insurance Study for Cecil County, dated 1988, or the most recent revision thereof.
 - (2) Flood Insurance Rate Map for Cecil County, Maryland (Unincorporated Areas) panels listed in Table 1, and all subsequent amendments and revisions to the FIRMs.

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- (C) The Board of Appeals shall notify IN WRITING, any applicant to whom a variance is granted to construct or substantially improve a building or structure with its lowest floor below the elevation required by these regulations that the variance is to the floodplain management requirements of these regulations only, and that the cost of Federal flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk, with rates up to twenty-five dollars (\$25) per one hundred dollars (\$100) of insurance coverage.
