| WHEREAS, Maryland's Enterprise Zone Tax Credit Program is a joint effort between the State and |

| local governments to provide tax incentives to businesses and property-owners located in economically |
| distressed communities; and |
| WHEREAS, the Cecil County Enterprise Zone is set to expire on December 14, 2013 thus eliminating |
| an important economic development tool for the County and the towns of Port Deposit, Perryville, North |
| East and Elkton; and |
| WHEREAS, The Cecil County Office of Economic Development desires to have the current |
| Enterprise Zone re-designated and expanded to allow existing businesses in Cecil County and prospective |
| new businesses to utilize incentives provided under Maryland's Enterprise Zone Tax Credit Program for an |
| additional 10 years; and |
| WHEREAS, the application will include additional sites in the towns of Perryville and Elkton, and |
| additional acreage surrounding Principio Business Park; and |
| WHEREAS, The primary benefits to businesses that are located within an Enterprise Zone are |
| eligibility for local property tax credits and State income tax credits; and |
| WHEREAS, Eligible businesses in an enterprise zone may claim a ten-year credit against local real |
| property taxes on a portion of real property improvements. The credit is 80 percent of the assessment |
| increase during the first five years. The credit then decreases 10 percent annually thereafter to 30 percent |
| in the tenth year; and |
| WHEREAS, Eligible businesses in an enterprise zone may claim one-year or three-year credits for |
| wages paid to new employees in new positions. The general credit is a one-time \$1,000 credit per new |
| worker. For economically disadvantaged employees, the credit increases to a total of \$6,000 per worker |
| distributed over three years. Businesses claim the enterprise zone income tax credits on the 500CR form |
| when they submit their business or individual income tax returns to the Comptroller; and |
| WHEREAS, The Enterprise Zone is an important incentive for the County to access to encourage |
| existing businesses to expand and attracting new businesses to locate within Cecil County. |
