RESOLUTION NO. 18-2016

Title of Resolution: Approval - Critical Area Growth Allocation - Town of Chesapeake City

Synopsis: A Resolution to approve the Growth Allocation request of the Town of Chesapeake City by re-designating three (3) acres of land, located off Boatyard Road in Chesapeake City, from Resource Conservation Area (RCA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA) in order to allow the development of a new wastewater treatment facility.

WHEREAS, it is the public policy of the State of Maryland that the Chesapeake and the Atlantic Coastal Bays and their tributaries are natural resources of great significance to the State and the nation, and their beauty, their ecological value and their economic impact all reach far beyond any one local jurisdiction, pursuant to section 8-1801(a)(1) of the Natural Resources Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Protection Act was established as a Resource Protection Program for the Chesapeake and the Atlantic Coastal Bays and their tributaries by fostering more sensitive

habitats; and

WHEREAS, the State's Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Act establishes procedures through which jurisdictions are allotted a certain amount of Growth Allocation that permits changes to be made to the County's Critical Area maps in order to accommodate desirable and anticipate growth; and

development activity for certain shoreline areas so as to minimize damage to water quality and natural

WHEREAS, the Cecil County Zoning Ordinance, Article XI. Overlay Zones, Part I. Critical Area District, Section 205, establishes a procedure for granting a Growth Allocation for properties located in the Towns; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Chesapeake City has requested that three (3) acres of land within the Critical Area and located on Parcel 240, Tax Map 43, off Boatyard Road, Chesapeake City, MD 21915, be granted a Growth Allocation by changing its Critical Area designation from Resource Conservation Area (RCA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA); and

WHEREAS, the proposed Growth Allocation will permit the development of a new wastewater treatment facility on this parcel; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Chesapeake City is in the process of upgrading its wastewater treatment facilities, which includes the consolidation of two existing wastewater treatment plants into a new single wastewater treatment plant to be located on the north side of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal; and the new facility will have a total treatment capacity of 300,000 gpd and be capable of meeting Enhanced Nutrient Removal (ENR) standards; and the new facility will be constructed on a new parcel adjacent to the existing North Wastewater Treatment Plant to allow the existing facilities to remain in service during construction; and the North Wastewater Treatment Plant will then be demolished and retrofitted to support the new wastewater treatment plant; and the South Wastewater Treatment Plant will be demolished and

the County Council.

NOW THEREFORE,BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,

MARYLAND, that the application for Growth Allocation by the Town of Chesapeake City, for 3 acres be

re-designated from Resource Conservation Area (RCA) to Intensely Developed Area (IDA).

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that this application be forwarded to the Maryland Critical Area Commission for final review and approval.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT this Resolution shall take effect sixty (60) calendar days after enactment by the Council.
