#### Chairman's Report – Mike Ratchford

- Minutes from EDC Meeting on April 6, 2016 were approved.
- Through Primary Election. Alan, Congratulations! Dan, we appreciate you running and bringing up the important issues and appreciate your continuing to serve both on the Council and on the EDC.
- Have had conclusion of Legislative Session
  - In 2017 question of paid leave will be particularly impactful for small businesses; most large employers have policies already in place and will be ok if legislation is passed. Believe we need to continue dialogue with legislators.
    - Dr. Roberts said Delegates believe it will pass next year. Chamber will run a seminar on how to look at current policies for small businesses. Small businesses need to be prepared for it.
- OED Budget Hearing held on April 19<sup>th</sup>. Appreciate subcommittee chairs attending and for the support for the Incubator Center. Technical Subcommittee has done a great job; and because of it, there is more understanding about it now.
- Attended Maryland Economic Development Association's Annual Conference. Vernon Thompson received the Hall of Fame Award with his 14-year old son in attendance at the ceremony.

# A Presentation on Susquehanna Workforce Network (SWN) was given by Bruce England, Executive Director.

- Non-profit organization, mostly funded through Federal Government
- Administer workforce funds for this region by working with business and community organizations
- Operate 3 Workforce Centers busiest center is Cecil County on Rt. 40 Connect job seekers to employment and training services
  - Serve Harford and Cecil Counties
  - Serve diverse group of job seekers
  - Served over 19,000 job seekers last year will surpass that number this year
- Types of Services Offered:

- Business Solutions & Engagement:
  - Cecil County has 1900 businesses
  - Help businesses recruit workforce
  - Provide training for workforce
    - Work in conjunction with Office of Economic Development (OED) training grant
    - Pay 50% of workers' wages for on-job training
  - Work with businesses experiencing mass layoffs
  - Hold rapid response meetings (have on-site State Unemployment reps & State Health Coverage reps available to answer employees' questions)
  - Provide resume building classes
  - Hold job fair for laid-off employees to help find other employment
  - Continue to work with laid-off employees
- Hold recruiting events at Susquehanna Workforce Network Centers
- Work with OED regarding prospects (businesses looking to start up or relocate in Cecil County)

Cecil County will be holding a Job Fair on Thursday, May 12, 2016, from 12:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. at Singerly Fire Company Banquet Hall in Elkton. Expected to have a record number of employers there.
