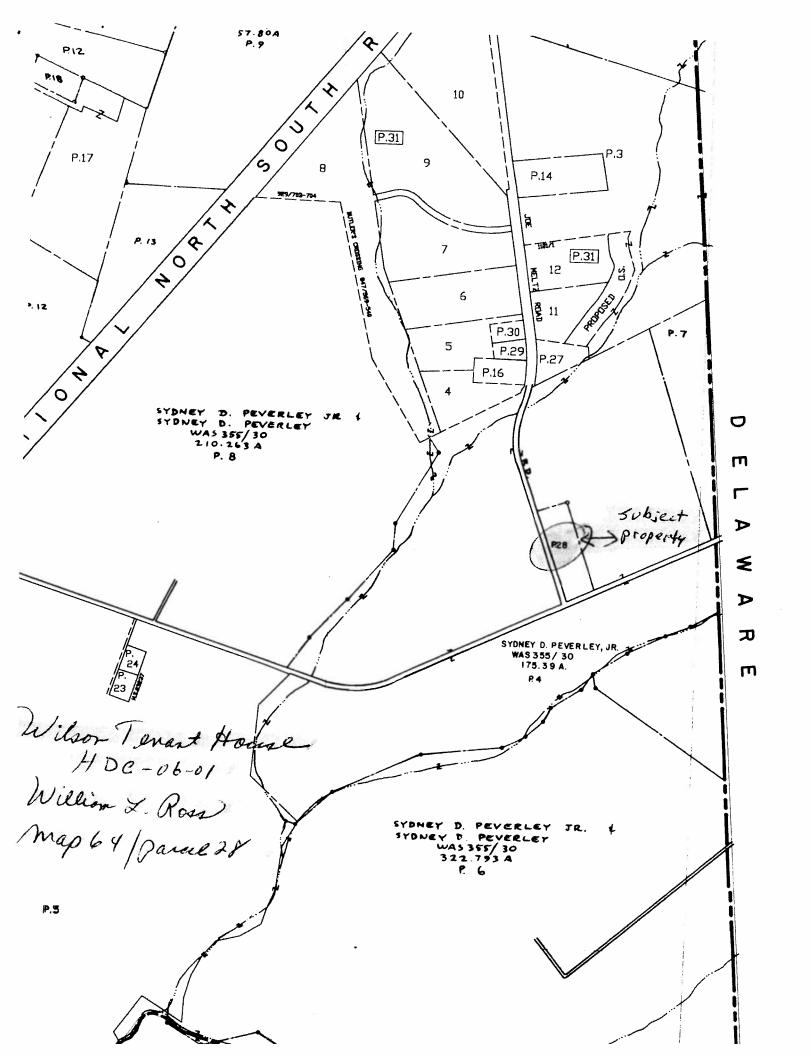

## CECIL COUNTY HISTORIC DISTRICT COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES 2 May 2006

**Present:** Cairns, Ed & Sally; Edwards, Ron & Audrey; Folk, Patricia; Simpers, Nancy; Sennstrom, Eric

Absent: Dixon, Mike

Call to order: Chairman Ed Cairns called the meeting to order at 3:15 p.m.

**Approval of minutes:** Motion made by Patricia Folk to approve the February 2006 meeting minutes. Motion seconded by Nancy Simpers. All in favor of motion, motion approved.

New business: Ed & Sally Cairns reported that they visited Capt. William Ross to tour the "Wilson Tenant House" on Joe Meltz Road. The Cairns reported that the house was lovely and has had quite a bit of money spent on its restoration. The house is included in the book "At the Head of the Bay", it is in a remote location, has a brick exterior with cedar shakes replacing the original tin roof. The windows have been replaced with 6X6 windows, there is Egyptian molding on the interior, the dwelling dates from circa 1840. Chairman Ed Cairns will encourage Capt. Ross to nominate the property for historic designation.

Chaiman Ed Cairns will fax a press release to Nancy Simpers. Patricia Folk reported that she has spoken to Lisa Tome at the *Herald* and that Ms. Tome is interested in doing a story.
