The written Program of Veterinary Care (PVC) must be completed by all Cecil County Cattery license holders.

The attending veterinarian shall establish, maintain and supervise physical examinations and vaccination schedules; protocols for disease control and prevention; pest and parasite control; as well as nutrition requirements and euthanasia for all cats on the premises of the licensee / cattery owner. Such programs should include regularly scheduled visits to the premises by the veterinarian to monitor animal health and animal husbandry practices. A copy of the written PVC shall be maintained in the cattery records. All cats over 12 weeks of age shall be examined by a veterinarian at least once every six months. During the examination, the veterinarian shall use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose and treat diseases and injuries.
