WHEREAS, pursuant to the Annotated Code of Maryland, Local Government Article, Section 9-201, 1 2 the County is authorized to acquire and hold property for a public purpose; and WHEREAS, pursuant to the Annotated Code of Maryland, Local Government Article, Section 1-601, 3 the County shall establish, maintain, and conduct a comprehensive program of public recreation and 4 5 parks for the benefit of the citizens; and 6 WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 402 of the Charter of Cecil County, the County Executive shall see 7 that the affairs of the executive branch are administered properly and efficiently; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 402 of the Charter, the duties and responsibilities of the Executive 8 include, but are not limited to, supervising and directing offices, agencies and divisions of the executive 9 10 branch; and 11 WHEREAS, the County Executive has submitted an amendment set forth herein to the County Council for consideration and approval. 12 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that Subsection 261-5 is hereby amended to add a new subsection 261-5(DD) Tobacco Use, 14 to Chapter 261 Parks and Recreation of the Code of Cecil County, Maryland, as follows: 15 16 §261-5 Parks rules and regulations 17 (DD) TOBACCO USE PROHIBITED. NO PERSON SHALL AT ANY TIME SELL OR USE TOBACCO PRODUCTS ON OR ABOUT ANY COUNTY PARKS 18 AND RECREATION OWNED OR LEASED PROPERTY. TOBACCO PRODUCTS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT 19 LIMITED TO, CIGARETTES, E-CIGARETTES, VAPORIZERS, PIPES, CIGARS, AND CHEWING TOBACCO. 20 21 AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect 60 calendar days from the date it 22 becomes law.
