 - Chris gave some background on himself
 - Chris is excited to be in this position; excited to help businesses grow and work with cooperators in County
 - In spare time, runs Cochran's Bees & Berries
- Still need Economic Development Coordinator posting position in next few weeks
- Primary election day June 26th, Early voting June 14th encourage everyone to turn out and vote
- One of our long-standing members and great contributors to the EDC and County will be stepping down from her official role at the end of the month. Dr. D'Ette Devine will be retiring.
 - We are glad to have Dr. Jeff Lawson here today
 - EDC presented Dr. Devine with a certificate of award

Director's Report - Chris Moyer

- Attended ICSC World's largest real estate conference in Vegas with Mayor Alt
- Dr. McCarthy, Mayor Alt, and I met with David Cordish to discuss developing properties in Cecil County
 - David very bullish on Cecil County wants to fill up Big Elk Mall hopefully will be more to share in coming months
- Interchange at Belvidere Road at Principio seeking Federal build grant up to \$25M

- Great team effort with administration; working with developer and MDTA
- Developer has engaged engineers and others to see if this can't be done
- Would offer Principio a road on to I-95
- Would strengthen marketing opportunities for Principio
- Gave tour to Economic Alliance of Greater Baltimore's board blown away at what they saw here
 - Toured Principio, where potential interchange at Belvidere would go, Clene nanomedicine, ATK (will be Northrup Grumman in two weeks) [sees future base for hypersonic and next generation programs], W.L. Gore
 - Great opportunities here for developers, builders, bankers, brokers
- Great meeting with head of Select Greater Philadelphia Council plan to work with them this fall on a manufacturing forum; we will be part of the host committee
 - Going to include Cecil County in forum and literature

Tourism Update was given by Sandy Maruchi-Turner, Tourism Manager

- Marketing via. radio, social media, eblast, digital, and print
- Wedding Brochure has become a hit
- Nature Brochure supply is low, has been most popular brochure even produced
- A handout was provided showing Industry Sales, Tourism Impact, and number of Visitors to Cecil County – to summarize,
 - 2016 (most recent year measured) Expenditures by Visitors in Cecil County \$168M
 - Over 2400 people in Tourism labor force income of \$98M
 - \$24M generated in State & Local Taxes
 - Over 1M visitors (this number based on people coming a distance of 50< miles)
- Tourists love to come to Cecil County to eat working with professional photographer to have good photography/representation of food options in County
- Received a grant from Upper Shore Regional Council will be used for social media videos
- Santa House opened as of last week
- Traveled to Charleston, SC to observe customer service techniques
 - 2 things learned: 1) Design standards colors, architectural consistency; 2) everyone from airport to car rental attendant have exceptional customer service skills
 - How can we improve customer service skills in Cecil County?

- 48:1 -- If I give you \$1, how many would give me 48 back?
- Economic impact multipliers what's return on dollars invested in incubation?
- If you put an incubator in Cecil County, where would you put it?
- Venture Access working on new iteration of old program in Harford County.
- TEDCO Challenge wanted to see something different in incubator community
 - Rural area it's about outreach and providing the right services
 - Creating a community for a program that serves entrepreneurs regardless of where they
 are
- Came up with new plan went from 0 to 6 to 12
- Biggest job is building startup ecosystem
 - Look at 3 Stages Idea, Launch, Growth
 - Supporters Evangelists, Government, Talent

- Venture Access offers access to educational opportunities, offers acceleration program, workshops, symposiums, connection (networking), guidance, space (help to connect lab space), ecosystem
- Key Initiatives: Technology, First Partner, Capital
- Need to do marketing, outreach to find these people.




