Synopsis A Bill to amend the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019, to transfer existing bond appropriation authority within the Roads and Bridges Capital Projects Budget in the amount of \$95,000 from the completed Replace Razor Strap Road Bridge Project to the Upgrade Nottingham Roads Facility Project.

Budget Transfer – Roads and Bridges Capital Budget – Upgrade Nottingham Roads Facility Project

1	WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 505 of the Cecil County Charter, on April 1, 2018, the	
2	County Executive submitted a proposed budget to the County Council for Fiscal Year 2019; and	
3	WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 506 of the Cecil County Charter, the County Council held	
4	public hearings on the proposed budget submitted by the County Executive for Fiscal Year 2019; and	
5	WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 507(b) of the Cecil County Charter, on June 5, 2018, the	
6	Budget for Cecil County was approved for Fiscal Year 2019; and	
7	WHEREAS, the County Executive is revising the Fiscal Year 2019 Roads & Bridges Capital Project	
8	Budget to transfer the unencumbered bond revenue and expense for Cecil County, Maryland remaining	
9	from the following completed Roads and Bridges Capital Project:	
10	a) To transfer \$95,000 from the completed Replace Razor Strap Road Bridge Project. The	
11	bridge project was completed in the summer of 2018 on time and under budget; and	
12	WHEREAS, such appropriation of unencumbered bond revenue and expense totaling \$95,000 is	
13	requested to be transferred to the Upgrade Nottingham Roads Facility Project:	
14	a) The project budget for the replacement of the vehicle storage building did not include	
15	sufficient funding for needed security, cameras, and access controls for the new space and	
16	the need to run conduit to facilitate the needs of the technology being used at the facility,	
17	and	
18	b) The project budget was not sufficient enough to pave the area around the facility or provide	
19	sufficient contingency funds for unanticipated site conditions.	
20	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,	

MARYLAND, that the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland, for Fiscal Year 2019 is hereby amended for the supplemental appropriation and by amending the Budget to appropriate the transfer of bond appropriations within the Roads and Bridges Capital Projects Budget in the amount of \$95,000 from the completed Replace Razor Strap Road Bridge Project to the Upgrade Nottingham Roads Facility Project.

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AND, BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that this Act shall take effect 60 calendar days from the date it becomes law.
