Information Required on Plot Plans for Building Permits

When making an application for a building permit, the applicant must have plans drawn with enough clarity and detailed dimensions to show the nature and character of the work to be performed.

- 1. A diagram of the property drawn showing the actual dimensions and shape of the lot to be built upon.
- 2. The exact size and location of buildings already existing on the property, if any.
- 3. The location and dimensions of the proposed building or alteration of existing structures, and distance from the property lines. The use of the proposed building and location must be labeled.
- 4. The location of the driveway and/or access to the property.
- 5. If the property is located in an overlay district (Critical Area, Floodplain, etc.), the following must be included:
 - A. Number and location of trees to be removed.
 - B. Location of impervious surfaces to added, removed, or modified.
- 6. There are many types of exhibits that may be used as a base map to include the above referenced information. The order of preference of these exhibits are:
 - A. As-Built survey
 - B. Location drawing from owner
 - C. GIS exhibit with a copy of the subdivision plat attached.
 - D. GIS exhibit
