# COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY LEGISLATIVE SESSION MINUTES LSD 2020-22 October 20, 2020

The County Council of Cecil County met in legislative session in an online virtual meeting because of the current health crisis and based on the Governor's orders to avoid public meetings. Council Members, presenters and members of the public participated in this meeting by going online to <a href="https://www.ccgov.org/council">www.ccgov.org/council</a> and selecting "livestream".

### **CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting of the County Council of Cecil County of October 20, 2020 was called to order by Council President Meffley at 7:00 p.m. Council President Meffley led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **ROLL CALL OF COUNCIL MEMBERS**

Council President Meffley asked for a roll call of attending Council Members. The Council Manager called the roll and recorded the following Council Members in attendance:

Roll Call Vote: Coutz-Present, Miller-Present, Patchell-Present, Gregory-Present, Meffley-Present.

Council President Meffley announced that there were five Council Members present, which constitute a quorum.

### **SUSPENSION OF RULES**

Councilman Coutz made a motion to suspend the rules to allow Council Members who are connected to participate and vote in this legislation session, because of the current health crisis and orders by the Governor to avoid public meetings. The motion was seconded by Vice President Gregory.

Roll Call Vote: Coutz-Y, Miller-Y, Patchell-Y, Gregory-Y, Meffley-Y The motion was approved unanimously.

### **OPENING PRAYER**

Councilman Miller introduced Reverend Tim Beardsley from St. John's United Methodist Church of Elkton, who delivered the opening prayer.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

On motion made by Councilman Coutz, seconded by Vice President Gregory, the Council moved to approve the legislative agenda of October 20, 2020. Motion was unanimously approved.

### PRESENTATION OF PROCLAMATIONS/CERTIFICATES

Councilman Al Miller presented a proclamation to recognize Economic Development Week, October 19-24, 2020, to Sandra Edwards, Acting Director of the Department of Economic Development.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

On motion made by Councilman Coutz, seconded by Vice President Gregory, the Council moved to approve the minutes of the legislative session of October 6, 2020. Motion was approved unanimously.

### **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

There were no public comments.

#### PRESIDENT AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Vice President Gregory thanked the audience for connecting to the session. She attended the Consolidated Transportation Plan meeting with the Maryland Department of Transportation and commended the State for having unified priorities with the County. She reminded the audience that it was Breast Cancer Awareness Month and urged all women to have regular breast screenings.

Councilman Coutz reminded all citizens to exercise their right to vote and urged them to take advantage of early voting. He attended the Sheriff's intel meeting and reported that calls have been up and down, but overdose statistics have continued to surpass last year's. He stated that the total number of fatal overdoses has risen to 71 for the year. He commended the Elkton Police Department for their handling of the recent protests and traffic flow without incidents. He congratulated Captain Joe Zurolo and Lieutenant Larry Waldridge for their outstanding performance.

Councilman Miller attended the Consolidated Transportation Plan meeting with the Maryland Department of Transportation. He commended the County's delegation for working together on behalf of Cecil County. He stated that State officials shared valuable information on their plans. He noted that there will likely be large cutbacks in funding because of the economy. He encouraged the public to support the online chicken sale that is sponsored by the Cecil County Fair board.

Councilman Patchell attended the Consolidated Transportation Plan meeting with the Maryland Department of Transportation. He commended Delegate Hornberger for his efforts for Cecil County's transportation needs. He requested MDOT to address the need for a sidewalk along Perryville High School, which has been planned since 2015. He noted the dangerous situation that students walk on th shoulder of MD 222. He also asked the State to assess the intersection of Jackson Station Road and US 40 because of the multiple accidents.

Council President Meffley attended the Consolidated Transportation Plan meeting with the Maryland Department of Transportation. He asked State officials to assess the need for a traffic light at the intersection of Elk Forest Road and MD 213 because of the traffic volume caused by Elkton Soccer League

participants. MDOT officials agreed to conduct a study. He stated that most of State government will be taking 12% to 15% reduction in their budget because of the economy. He presented a proclamation in recognition of White Cane Awareness Day to Dan Hause of Chesapeake City. He participated in a Classroom Teachers Association candidate forum. He also stated that he has worked with citizens on individual issues of septic hookups, traffic on Hatem Bridge and trash removal.

Al Wein, Director of Administration, provided comments. There were no Council questions or comments.

An Act authorizing the establishment of the Cecil County, Maryland Opioid Litigation Settlement Trust Fund; approving the form of Trust Agreement relating thereto and the provisions therein regarding the administration of the Trust Fund; authorizing and empowering the trustees of the Trust Fund to invest and manage the assets of the Trust Fund; and generally providing certain matters with respect to the Trust Fund.

# Amendment No. 01 to Bill No. 2020-12

**Synopsis:** To require any amendments to the Trust agreement must be proposed by the Executive and approved by the Council.

Introduced by: Council President Meffley, Councilman Coutz and Councilman Patchell

On page 3, lines 29-31, delete in its entirety and insert the following:

"Section 6. As set forth in Section 7.02 of the Trust Agreement, the Trust Agreement may be amended by a proposal by the County Executive by legislation and approval by the County Council."

On page 13 of Exhibit A. Trust Agreement, in Section 7.02 Amendment of the Trust Agreement, Subsection (c), delete in its entirety and insert the following:

"(c) Any amendment to this Trust Agreement shall be proposed by the County Executive by legislation and approved by the County Council."

The Bill was introduced on September 1, 2020, and public hearing held and concluded on October 6, 2020, and scheduled for final consideration on October 20, 2020.

There were no administration comments. Council questions and comments ensued.

Councilman Miller was opposed to the amendment without the inclusion of the requirement that two thirds of the trustees must approve any changes to the trust agreement. Councilman Patchell and Vice President Gregory agreed with Councilman Miller.

# Bill No. 2020-13 Bond Authorization - Refunding Bonds - By Executive Order

An Act authorizing and empowering Cecil County, Maryland, from time to time, to issue and sell its general obligation bonds in one or more series for the purpose of refunding all or a portion of its outstanding general obligation bonds and the bonds authorized hereby; empowering the County Executive to execute and deliver one or more executive orders prior to issuing the bonds in order to fix, prescribe and determine the details of the bonds and the issuance and sale thereof; empowering and directing the County to levy ad valorem taxes in rate and amount sufficient to provide funds for the payment of the maturing principal of and interest on the bonds; exempting the bonds from the provisions of Sections 19-205 and 19-206 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, or successor provisions; providing that the County may issue and sell all or any portion of the bonds, as bonds the interest on which is not excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes; and relating generally to the issuance and sale of such bonds.

The Bill was introduced on September 1, 2020, and public hearing held and concluded on October 6, 2020, and scheduled for final consideration on October 20, 2020.

There were no administration comments. Council questions and comments ensued.

Councilman Miller moved to approve Bill No. 2020-13, which was seconded by Councilman Patchell.

Roll call vote: Coutz-N, Miller-Y, Patchell-Y, Gregory-N, Meffley-N

The motion failed by a vote of 2 to 3. Councilman Coutz, Vice President Gregory and Council President Meffley were opposed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Council Manager Massey stated for the record:

PROPERTY OWNER: Samuel Stanley, PRESENTLY ZONED: High Density Residential (RM)

Cecil County Public Schools - Budget Amendment #79

Councilman Miller made a motion to approve Budget Amendment #79, in the amount of \$187,318 for September 2020, which was seconded by Councilman Coutz. The Council unanimously approved the motion by a voice vote of 5 to 0.

On motion made by Councilman Coutz, seconded by Vice President Gregory, Council President Meffley adjourned the meeting at 8:04 p.m.
