





PERSONNEL- \$5,437,514


100 Employees/84 FTEs Staff 7 Branches, Bookmobile and Outreach Services, Administrative and Support Services

COLLECTIONS- \$664,565

All Print, Digital, and AV Materials, Databases, Online learning resources, lending kits for 7 branches

FACILITIES & TECHNOLOGY- \$726,983

Maintenance and utilities on 4 County owned buildings; 1 Town supported building; 2 leased buildings, vehicles, public technology access and infrastructure, Wifi and Broadband services, licensing, insurance, networks, hardware/software



OTHER- \$558,101

Public programs, supplies, contracted and professional expenses




What do these funds do?

- Create free access to thousands of learning resources and programs for community members of all ages.
- Provide the only free access to computers and high speed broadband in the county.
- Employ an award-winning team of highly committed, community-focused professionals who are a lifeline for people.
- Make community gathering, work, and meeting spaces available in all geographic reaches of the county.
- Deliver critical resources and support to underserved and vulnerable communities using the outreach Bookmobile.
- Provide safe, staffed spaces for children and teens after-school and during the summer months.
- Deliver critical support services to veterans, seniors, entrepreneurs, small business owners, youth, and families.
- Serve 101,000+ Cecil County Citizens using less than 3% of the County's overall budget.

North East Branch Library

- First new library opened in Cecil County in 13 years; County purchased the site in June 2015 and began allocating funds for design and construction to the Board of Library Trustees in 2017.
- Replaces a 2,800 SF building with a 33,000 SF regional library designed for growth
- New Library Headquarters (10,000 SF) allows for low-cost renovation and on-site expansion of 35 year old Elkton Branch= 2 for 1



New North East Branch Library & Library Administrative Headquarterscombined 43,000 SF (33,000 + 10,000)



- Built to serve a current regional population of 26,195 citizens (based on WILMAPCO planning data); population is projected to increase to 35,325 by 2040 (WILMAPCO)
- Constructed to meet state planning standards of 1SF per capita
 (minimum) in order to receive state funding grants of \$3.84 million
- Moving Library Administrative Headquarters to North East allows Elkton branch to be improved and renovated, adding at least 20 years to its utility.
- Designed with wide community input from thousands of citizens, business owners, and stakeholders. Features include an Early Literacy Center, Business Commons and Digital Media Lab, large Teen Center, Community Meeting and Study Rooms, public computer labs, and access to 70,000+ books and resources.



North East Branch Library Funding Sources

- County Construction Funds- \$18.4 mil
- State Matching Construction Grant Awards-\$3.84
 mil
- Friends Foundation of CCPL- Raising the 21st
 Century Child campaign raised significant private and public support to enhance spaces for Children, Families, and Teens, including a State Matching Bond Bill to build the Our Town Early Literacy Center, sponsored by Senator Hershey and Delegate Hornberger





North East Branch Library Operational Needs

- 5 staff in a 2,800 SF Library \rightarrow 28 staff in a 33,000 SF Library, plus support (custodians, computer technician)
- Maintenance, Utilities, Inspections, shared CAM fees with shopping center tenants
- Total operational costs- approximately \$1.25 mil
- County planned to fully fund Operational Plan in FY21
- Funds received for North East Branch Library operations to date- \$257,000
- Operating Deficit of approximately \$1million dollars going into FY22




FY22 Financial Position

- \$1mil unfunded North East Branch Library Operations, FY21
- \$266,000 unfunded System and North East Branch Library Operations, FY22
- \$366,202 in FY22 Budget reduction of 5.7%
- TOTAL OPERATING DEFICIT FOR FY22: \$1.632 MILLION

FY22 Operating Budget Impacts

PERSONNEL

- No COLAs or Merit increases for library employees; County health insurance plan increases for employees and employer unfunded.
- Maintenance and custodial shortages
- Limited personnel to staff and operate the new North East Branch Library
- Reduced public programs and services for youth, businesses, workforce

FACILITIES AND TECHNOLOGY

- Reduced hours and services at all library branches, including the new North East Branch Library
- Limited equipment replacements and improvements

COLLECTIONS

- Reduced capability to purchase high demand digital content and services for the community.
- Restricted purchasing of materials- reduced collections and longer wait times for materials
