WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Division 1, Title 4, Subtitle 1, Section				
4-101(a)(1), Land Use Article, it is the policy of the State that orderly development and use of land and				
structure requires comprehensive regulation through the implementation of planning and zoning				
controls; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-102, Land Use Article, a legislative				
body may regulate to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-103, Land Use Article, a legislative				
body may impose any additional conditions or limitations that the legislative body considers appropriate				
to improve or protect the general character and design of the land and improvements being zoned or				
rezoned; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-202, Land Use Article, the				
legislative body shall adopt zoning regulations in accordance with the plan, with reasonable				
consideration for the character of the district or zone and its uses and with a view to conserve the value				
of property and encourage orderly development and the most appropriate use of land; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(a), Land Use Article, a				
legislative body shall provide for the manner in which its zoning regulations and the boundaries of				
districts and zones shall be established, enforced and amended; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(b)(1), Land Use Article, a				
legislative body shall hold at least one public hearing on a proposed zoning regulation or boundary at				
which parties of interest and citizens have an opportunity to be heard; and				
WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(b)(2), Land Use Article,				
the legislative body shall publish notice of the time and place of the public hearing, together with a				
summary of the proposed zoning regulations or boundary, in at least one newspaper of general				
circulation in the local jurisdiction once each week for 2 successive weeks; and				
WHEREAS, the zoning ordinance of Cecil County permits animal husbandry on NAR, SAR, RR, LDR,				
ST, VR, UR, M1, M2, MEA and OS zones on a minimum lot size of one acre; and				
WHEREAS, the zoning for animal husbandry includes back yard chickens, which might be raised				

by a family for their own use; and

29	WHEREAS, there has been a trend of families to raise their own food because of the pandemic			
30	and the desire to ensure that their food is free of additives; and			
31	WHEREA	WHEREAS, residents of Cecil County has expressed their desire to raise backyard chickens for the

33	WHEREAS, the Cecil County Planning Commission reviewed the proposed amendments on			
34	November 15, 2021.			
35	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,			
36	MARYLAND, that the proposed amendment to Article V, Part I, Section 58, Animal Husbandry of the Cecil			
37	County Zoning Ordinance is hereby adopted as follows:

40	a. Ti	he raising of backyard chickens in residential zones shall be permitted in		
41	Northern Agricultural Residential (NAR) and Southern Agricultural Residential (SAR) 1/acre minor;

52	2)	The lot shall be improved with a single-family detached dwelling that is occupied as		
53		a residence.		
54	3)	The maximum number of chickens is eight hens. Roosters are prohibited.		
55	4)	A weather and predator-proof hen house/chicken coop shall be provided. This		
56		shelter shall be located in the rear yard and shall be located 15 feet from all lot		
57		lines at a minimum, 50 feet from a neighboring dwelling, and shall not create a

58		nuisance. This minimum distance cannot be reduced through variance procedures.
59		The hen house shall allow adequate air circulation to prevent the concentration of
60		odors. Any chicken coop that has not been actively used to house chickens for a
61		year must be taken down and removed from property.
62	5)	Hens shall have access to an outdoor enclosure that is adequately fenced to contain
63		birds on the property.
64	6)	Feed must be kept in secure containers so as not to attract vermin.
65	7)	The owner(s) shall conduct proper litter management practices within the shelter
66		so that odors are not detectible from adjoining properties. Waste must be
67		composted or removed from the property.
68	8)	Chickens kept in accordance with this regulation must also be registered with the
69		Maryland Department of Agriculture as required by section 3-804 of the Agriculture
70		Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
71	9)	Dwellings located within a residential area within homeowner associations must
72		adhere to regulations related to raising backyard chickens.
73	10)	The outdoor slaughtering of chickens is prohibited.
74	AND BE IT FU	RTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect 60 calendar days from the date that
75	it becomes law.
