Supplemental Appropriations – Grants – Sheriff's Office – Crime Control and Prevention

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 505 of the Cecil County Charter, on April 1, 2021, the County Executive submitted a proposed budget to the County Council for Fiscal Year 2022; and WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 506 of the Cecil County Charter, the County Council held public hearings on the proposed budget submitted by the County Executive for Fiscal Year 2022; and WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 507(b) of the Cecil County Charter, on June 1, 2021, the Budget for Cecil County was adopted for Fiscal Year 2022; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive is revising the Fiscal Year 2022 Special Revenue Other Grants

Fund – Sheriff's Office-Law Enforcement revenue estimate for Cecil County to establish the following

amount: the addition of \$95,000 in grant revenue and expense to the Special Revenue Other Grants Fund

– Sheriff's Office- Law Enforcement budget to provide for the grant award from the Governor's Office of

Crime Control and Prevention; and

WHEREAS, such appropriation is necessary to provide \$95,000 in grant funding to provide bonuses to sworn deputies and to assist with the cost required for uniform dry cleaning. Such incentives for current deputies are designed to retain current sworn staff and help encourage perspective new recruits to join the agency.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland for Fiscal Year 2022 is amended for the supplemental appropriation, and by amending the Current Budget to appropriate \$95,000 in additional expenditures in the Special Revenue Other Grants Fund — Sheriff's Office-Law Enforcement, to record the grant awarded from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention for the purpose of attracting and retaining qualified Deputies to join the Cecil County Sheriff's Office.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect on the date of its passage by the County Council of Cecil County, Maryland.

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION

SPONSOR: Council President at the request of the County Executive

RESOLUTION NO. 55-2021 – Supplemental Appropriation – Grants – Sheriff's Office – Crime Control and Prevention.

SYNOPSIS: A resolution to amend the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022, to provide a total of \$95,000 to the Special Revenue Other Grants Fund- Sheriff's Office-Law Enforcement to record the grant awarded from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention for the purpose of attracting and retaining qualified Deputies to join the Cecil County Sheriff's Office.

<u>FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY</u>: Net fiscal impact to the County will be zero for Fiscal 2022. The grant award is providing all funding to support the bonuses and reimbursement of uniform dry-cleaning costs.

FISCAL ANALYSIS:

The Cecil County Sheriff's Office applied for and was awarded a grant from the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention (GOCCP) to help the agency attract and retain qualified Deputies. The Sheriff's Office as well as other law enforcement agencies across the Country are having difficulty attracting and retaining qualified law enforcement officers. Police officers are quitting the job, and few are applying to take their place. This is a nationwide trend that started several years ago and is exacerbated by the current climate that is increasingly dangerous, lacks public support and incurs intense media scrutiny.

To allow the Sheriff's Office to retain the sworn Deputies in the agency today, the GOCCP awarded grant funds to support a one-time longevity bonus and reimbursement for the cost of dry-cleaning uniforms. The GOCCP is hoping these types of incentives not only convince Deputies to stay, but also encourage new recruits to join the Cecil County Sheriff's Office.
