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WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Division 1, Title 4, Subtitle 1, Section 4-101(a)(1), Land Use Article, it is the policy of the State that orderly development and use of land and structure requires comprehensive regulation through the implementation of planning and zoning controls; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-102, Land Use Article, a legislative body may regulate to promote the health, safety, and general welfare of the community; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-103, Land Use Article, a legislative body may impose any additional conditions or limitations that the legislative body considers appropriate to improve or protect the general character and design of the land and improvements being zoned or rezoned; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-202, Land Use Article, the legislative body shall adopt zoning regulations in accordance with the plan, with reasonable consideration for the character of the district or zone and its uses and with a view to conserve the value of property and encourage orderly development and the most appropriate use of land; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(a), Land Use Article, a legislative body shall provide for the manner in which its zoning regulations and the boundaries of districts and zones shall be established, enforced and amended; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(b)(1), Land Use Article, a legislative body shall hold at least one public hearing on a proposed zoning regulation or boundary at which parties of interest and citizens have an opportunity to be heard; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Annotated Code of Maryland, Section 4-203(b)(2), Land Use Article, the legislative body shall publish notice of the time and place of the public hearing, together with a summary of the proposed zoning regulations or boundary, in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the local jurisdiction once each week for 2 successive weeks; and WHEREAS, the zoning ordinance of Cecil County permits animal husbandry on NAR, SAR, RR, LDR, ST, VR, UR, M1, M2, MEA and OS zones on a minimum lot size of one acre; and WHEREAS, the zoning for animal husbandry includes back yard chickens, which might be raised

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by a family for their own use; and

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| 29 | WHEREAS, there has been a trend of families to raise their own food because of the pandemic |
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| 30 | and the desire to ensure that their food is free of additives; and |
| 31 | WHEREAS, residents of Cecil County has expressed their desire to raise backyard chickens for the |
| 32 | health benefit and quality of life for their families; and |
| 33 | WHEREAS, the Cecil County Planning Commission reviewed the proposed amendments on |
| 34 | November 15, 2021 and December 20, 2021. |
| 35 | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, |
| 36 | MARYLAND, that the proposed amendment to Article V, Part I, Section 58, Animal Husbandry of the Cecil |
| 37 | County Zoning Ordinance is hereby adopted as follows: |
| 38 | Section 58A. Backyard Chickens (1.01.310) |
| 39 | Backyard Chickens shall be permitted in the NAR, SAR, RR, LDR, ST, and OS zones, provided that: |
| 40 | 1. The minimum lot size is 20,000 square feet. |
| 41 | 2. The lot shall be improved with a detached dwelling and the owner of the backyard chickens |
| 42 | shall occupy the dwelling unit on the premises. |
| 43 | 3. All chickens shall be within an enclosed continuous solid fence at least four (4) feet in height. |
| 44 | 4. Written consent from the Homeowners Associations must be obtained prior to |
| 45 | application, if applicable. |
| 46 | 5. The maximum number of chickens permitted is eight (8). |
| 47 | 6. Enclosures for backyard chickens shall meet the same setbacks restrictions for an accessory |
| 48 | structure. |
| 49 | 7. A License must be obtained prior obtaining the chickens for the property and must be renewed |
| 50 | annually. Evidence of current registration with the Maryland Department of Agriculture registration |
| 51 | must be included with application for a license unless the owner is exempt from registration under |
| 52 | state law. |
| 53 | 8. The slaughter of chickens and sale of eggs for human consumption is prohibited. |
| 54 | BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the |
| 55 | proposed amendment to Article II, Part I, Section 12, Definitions of Basic Terms of the Cecil County Zoning |
| 56 | Ordinance is hereby adopted as follows: |
| 57 | "Backyard Chicken" means the raising, boarding, and/or selling of a domesticated female chicken and |
| 58 | Does not include roosters, ducks, turkeys, exotic fowl, goose or other bird, or foul on parcels or lots |

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under one acre.

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BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the proposed amendment to Article IV, Section 54.4, Table of Permissible Uses of the Cecil County Zoning Ordinance is hereby adopted as shown in Appendix 1A and 1B.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect 60 calendar days from the date that it becomes law.
