Title of Resolution: Charter Amendment – Redistricting Commission

Synopsis: A Resolution amending Article 2, County Council, Section 214, Redistricting, of the Cecil County Charter to provide that the deadline for Council to establish Redistricting Commission shall be within thirty days after receipt of census data; and to specify that current local central committee members are ineligible to be members of the Redistricting Commission. To require submission of this amendment to the legally qualified voters of Cecil County for their adoption or rejection in accordance with Section 602 of the Charter of Cecil County.

1	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter, the Charter
2	may be amended by the procedures provided in Article XI-A of the Maryland Constitution; and
3	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, amendments to
4	any charter adopted by any County of this State under the provisions of this Article may be
5	proposed by a resolution of the Council of the County, or by a petition signed by not less than
6	20% of the registered voters of the City or County, provided, however, that in any case 10,000
7	signatures shall be sufficient to complete a petition; and
8	WHEREAS, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., §7-103(a)(iii) and §7-103(c)(3)(i) of the Election
9	Law Article, the Attorney, designated to represent the county legislative body, shall prepare
10	and certify, and submit to the State Board of Election, not later than August 5, 2022, the
11	following information as required under §7-103(b) of the Election Law Article for each question
12	to be voted on in the County: (1) a question number or letter as by the Election Board; (2) a
13	brief designation of the type or source of the question; (3) a brief descriptive title in boldface
14	type; (4) a condensed statement of the purpose of the question; and (5) the voting choices that
15	the voter has; and
16	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and
17	Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, the amendments shall be published by the
18	President of the County Council once a week for five successive weeks prior to the election in at
19	least one newspaper published in said County; and
20	WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and
21	Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, an amendment so proposed shall be submitted to
22	the voters of the County at the next general or congressional election occurring after the
23	passage of the resolution; and
24	WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and
25	Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, if at the election the majority of the votes cast for
26	the amendment shall be in favor thereof, the amendment shall be adopted and become a part
27	of the charter of the County from and after the thirtieth day after said election; and
28	WHEREAS, Article 2, County Council, Section 214, Redistricting, of the Cecil County
29	Charter currently provides that:

30	" (a) The Council shall appoint by resolution a Redistricting Commission not later than April 1
31	of the year following each decennial census date. The central committee of each political party
32	polling at least twenty-five percent of the total vote cast for the Executive at the last
33	preceding general election shall nominate five persons to serve on the Commission. Each such
34	list shall include one person who resides in each residency district. The Council shall appoint al
35	such nominees as members of the Commission as well as one or two additional members of
36	the Commission, as the case may be, to ensure that its total membership equals an odd
37	number. The Council shall appoint the Chair of the Commission from among the Commission
38	members. No person shall be eligible for appointment to the Commission who holds elective
39	office.
40	(b) By November 15 of the year before the year in which redistricting is to take effect, the
41	Commission shall present to the Council a plan of residency districts, together with a report
42	explaining it. Within thirty days of receiving the plan of the Commission, the Council shall hold
43	a public hearing on the plan. If within ninety days after submission of the plan no other
44	legislation reestablishing the boundaries of the residency districts has been enacted, the plan
45	as submitted shall become law.
46	(c) Any residency district established in accordance with this section shall be compact,
47	contiguous, substantially equal in population, and have common interests as a result of
48	geography, occupation, history, or existing political boundaries.
49	(d) An ordinance establishing residency districts shall be exempt from referendum."; and
50	WHEREAS, in accordance with Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and
51	Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, this Resolution proposes the following
52	amendment to Article 2, County Council, Section 214, Redistricting, of the Cecil County Charter:

77	Redistricting, of the Cecil County Charter, shall be submitted to the voters of the County at the
78	next general or congressional election in accordance with Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil
79	County Charter and Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution:
80	"(a) The Council shall appoint by resolution a Redistricting Commission not later than ONE

93	Commission shall present to the Council a plan of residency districts, together with a report
94	explaining it. Within thirty days of receiving the plan of the Commission, the Council shall hold
95	a public hearing on the plan. If within ninety days after submission of the plan no other
96	legislation reestablishing the boundaries of the residency districts has been enacted, the plan
97	as submitted shall become law.
98	(c) Any residency district established in accordance with this section shall be compact,
99	contiguous, substantially equal in population, and have common interests as a result of
100	geography, occupation, history, or existing political boundaries.
101	(d) An ordinance establishing residency districts shall be exempt from referendum."; and
102	AND BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,
103	MARYLAND, that, pursuant to Md. Code Ann., §7-103(a)(iii) and §7-103(c)(3)(i) of the Election
104	Law Article, the Attorney, designated to represent the county legislative body, shall prepare,
105	certify, and submit to the State Board of Election, not later than August 5, 2022, the following
106	information as required under §7-103(b) of the Election Law Article: (1) a question number or
107	letter as by the Election Board; (2) a brief designation of the type or source of the question; (3)
108	a brief descriptive title in boldface type; (4) a condensed statement of the purpose of the
109	question; and (5) the voting choices that the voter has.
110	AND BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,
111	MARYLAND, that pursuant to Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and Article XI-A
112	§5 of the Maryland Constitution, the amendments shall be published by the President of the
113	County Council once a week for five successive weeks prior to the election in at least one
114	newspaper published in said County.
115	AND BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY,

MARYLAND, that pursuant to Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and Article XI-A,

§5 of the Maryland Constitution, the aforementioned proposed amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the County at the next general or congressional election occurring after the passage of this Resolution.

AND BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that in accordance with Article 6, Section 602 of the Cecil County Charter and Article XI-A, §5 of the Maryland Constitution, if at the election the majority of the votes cast for the aforementioned proposed amendment shall be in favor thereof, then the proposed amendment shall be adopted and become a part of the Charter of Cecil County from and after the thirtieth day after said election.
