Call to Order & Welcome – Mike Ratchford

- Meeting called to order at 8:00 a.m.
- January 4, 2023, meeting minutes approved

Chairman's Report – Mike Ratchford

- Welcome Megan McRay, new Executive Director, Cecil County Chamber of Commerce
- State of County breakfast very successful – good to see everyone in person, great to hear updates from County Executive and Bill Sorenson
- First month of MD General Assy concluded – over 1,000 bills presented
 - Hope to have future report from Government Relations Committee

Director's Report – Update on Economic Development – OED Staff

Economic Development Manager Update – Sandra Edwards

- Video for Business Attraction purposes-- revisions made to first cut; planning series of 3 video with release this spring
- Grants – Digital Marketing Workshop in October
 - Awarded 14 grants; have <\$3,000 funding remaining; looking at future social media workshops
- Legislation re Enterprise Zone
 - Restrictions on land to determine eligibility – over 50% of Cecil land not eligible – Cecil County will be opposing bill
- Salesforce CRM Platform – many accounts entered, working on entering projects and contacts; generate reports
- Bill Sorenson presented at State of County – even with recession looming, things still looking good in Cecil County

Sandy Maruchi-Turner, Tourism Manager Update:

- Winter Lights Cecil Nights half over – clearly people looking for things to do in winter
 - February: Cecilton Life on the Chesapeake; Elkton's Soup There It Is Contest, Snow Much fun, carriage rides, Sip N Stroll, scavenger hunts, wagon rides, fire pit nights, night hike, geo cashing, open house Fairwinds Farm
- Spring ad planning
- Show month – booth at Travel & Adventure Show in DC, MD Office of Tourism booth at Great American Outdoor Show in Harrisburg

Richard Starr, Economic Development Coordinator Update:

- December activity slow but has picked up – talking to couple of employers coming to County
- New Utility Workers Training School coming to Cecil Co – offering CDL, basic OSHA training class, aerial electrical connections, high voltage, gas lines, etc.
 - Closest school in Georgia; big deal for MD and region
 - Hoping to open 3Q23
 - AUI Power training center remains in place for AUI employees; new school for non-AUI employees

Maureen O'Shea Fitzgerald, Agribusiness Coordinator Update:

- Lots of prospect activity
- Closed Upper Shore Ag grants yesterday; 21 applications; highly competitive grant; program won award at MACo
 - Excited to house program in conjunction with USRC
- Rooted in Our Community: Feeding a Growing Population in a Global Food System – Sat, Mar 4th at Cecil College, 9:00am start -- FREE event

A Workforce Update was presented by Kimberly Justus, Executive Director, Susquehanna Workforce Network (SWN)

- CDL program at Cecil College amazing – SWN funds training for individuals
- Cecil County Employment by Industry as of 4Q2020
 - Trades, Transportation and Utilities largest sector; biggest industry impacting Cecil
 - Education & Health Services and Manufacturing – next largest
 - Construction and Professional & Business Services at 4%
 - Leisure & Hospitality at 11%; Local Government at 13%
 - 5 regions with Stars – priority industries for funding; large field and room to grow for individuals entering industries
- Unemployment as of 11/2022
 - MD 3.5%; Cecil County 3.6%; historically low unemployment rates
 - Delaware State 4.1%; New Castle County 3.9%
- Unemployment Rate
 - 2013-2020 slowly decreasing unemployment rate; then major spike due to COVID – trending down since
 - Cecil County closely in line with state of MD
- Employment Trends as of 2Q2022
 - Total employment for Cecil County 37,032 based on 4Q moving average
 - Overall declined 1.8% in region over year; Cecil had decline in 2021
- Wage Trends as of 2Q2022
 - Average wage in Cecil County \$53,991

- Annual wages increased by 9.1% in region; Cecil's wages gone up more than US and state averages
- Jobs & Candidates Available as of 1/29/2023
 - 179 openings in Cecil County; 8,000 individuals looking for work
- Cecil County Industry
 - Retail trade, public administration, finance and insurance, real estate rental and leasing growing
 - Magazine, newspaper, utilities dropped slightly
 - Overall industries growing
- Gross Domestic Product
 - In 2021, nominal GDP contracted 0.1%; follows growth of 1.0% in 2020
 - Total GDP in Cecil County \$4,198,675,000
 - Sectors that make up GDP: manufacturing, health care and social assistance, public administration, transportation & warehousing, retail trade are tops
- Impacts on Workforce Attraction
 - Increased savings during pandemic due to enhanced unemployment, stimulus checks, delayed student loan payments
 - Early retirements
 - Lack of access to Childcare – availability, reliability, and cost
 - Entrepreneurship
 - Entry Level Wage Increases – Entry Level Warehouse hiring at \$18/hr. w/some incentives going up to \$22/hr.
 - Inflation – Annual rate ≈7% dwindling savings
- SWN publishes HOT JOBS every Thursday – plenty of jobs available
 - Contact Kim if interested in receiving lists; businesses can be included in listing
- Get Connected – Increase employee attraction (Virtual)

- Training funding is available for incumbent workers for businesses

Education Update – Dr. Jeffrey Lawson

- Growth in education down -1.9% over past 5 yrs.
- First roll out of state aid for the blueprint
 - Significant increase in state funding \$15M, earmarked for specific area
 - \$3.3M for Pre-K; Cost per pupil in public school system \$14K-\$16K/year
 - Spending to be determined by State
- Debates over appropriateness of books

Cecil College Update – Dr. Mary Bolt

- Spring Enrollment up 2%
- Advanced Trades Education Scholarship – geared to people having difficulties getting into trades (homelessness, etc.)
 - Cecil College Foundation has funding to help with transportation, child care, clothing
- Friday – presenting to Eastern Shore Delegation

Cecil County Public Library – Morgan Miller

- Launching new program in partnership with MD Legal Aid Bureau – Lawyer in the Library
 - Set up appointments for free legal advice (landlord tenant, family law, foreclosure/bankruptcy)
 - Morgan looking into small business access for same program
- Strategic Planning – create next 3 years of teaching plan
 - Survey sent out; overwhelmed with responses
 - In person sessions – community & business leaders @ NE Library (Feb)

Cecil County Chamber Update – Megan McRay

- Continuing to meet with folks 1-on-1 – see how Chamber can continue to partner
- Bringing awareness to County as to what’s happening in different industries
- Contact Megan if have events, etc. she should attend

Small Business Update – Mike Travers

- Thank Richard/OED for reaching out to B&B Seafood – great feedback on quick response and assistance

Legislative Update – Dr. Carl Roberts

- Budget -- Important to properly fund public institutions (library, College, public school, Sheriff’s office)
- Governor’s “no one left behind” – public institutions critically important to ensuring this
