**Title of Bill:** Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2025 – Fiscal Year 2029 Capital Improvement Program – Public Safety Training Center, Project Number 51030 and Paramedic Station #2, Project Number 50051

**Synopsis:** A Bill to amend the Annual Budget and Appropriations Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, to revise the funding sources for the Public Safety Training Center project, Project Number 51030 and Paramedic Station #2, Project Number 50051. The Public Safety Training Center will see an increase in Bond funding of \$270,000 while seeing a decrease in ARPA funding of \$270,000. The Paramedic Station #2 will see a decrease in Bond funding of \$270,000 while seeing an increase in ARPA funding of \$270,000.

Supplemental Appropriation – Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2025 Capital Improvement
Program – Public Safety Training Center, Project Number 51030
and Paramedic Station #2, Project Number 50051

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 505 of the Cecil County Charter, on April 1, 2024, the County 1 Executive submitted a proposed budget to the County Council for Fiscal Year 2025; and 2 WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 506 of the Cecil County Charter, the County Council held public 3 hearings on the proposed budget submitted by the County Executive for Fiscal Year 2025; and 4 5 WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 507(b) of the Cecil County Charter, on June 04, 2024, the 6 Budget for Cecil County was adopted for Fiscal Year 2025; and 7 WHEREAS, Section 514 of the Charter of Cecil County allows the County Council to amend the Annual 8 Budget and Appropriations Ordinance to provide funds for a Capital Project not previously appearing in the 9 Capital Budget for the fiscal year; and WHEREAS, the Approved Capital Improvement Program for Fiscal Year 2025 provides a total of 10 \$7,250,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funds for the Public Safety Training Center project, and, 11 WHEREAS, American Rescue Plan Act funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended 12 by December 31, 2026; and 13 WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works recommends having \$270,000 in a contingency fund to 14 15 fund owner-directed or other change orders required on the Public Safety Training Center project; and WHEREAS, the contingency funds must be available throughout the estimated two-year design and 16 construction period of the project, meaning that American Rescue Plan Act funds are not suitable for this 17 purpose; and 18 WHEREAS, the County Executive is requesting to swap out \$270,000 in American Rescue Plan Act 19 funds on the Public Safety Training Center project for \$270,000 in County bond funds on the DES Paramedic 20 21 Station 2 project, Project Number 50051, to provide the Public Safety Training Center project with the 22 necessary contingency funds. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, 23 MARYLAND, that the Annual Budget and Appropriations Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland, for Fiscal 24 Year 2025 and the Capital Budget are hereby amended by transferring \$270,000 in American Rescue Plan Act 25 funding from the Public Safety Training Center project to the DES Paramedic Station 2 project, and \$270,000 26 in County bond funding from the DES Paramedic Station 2 project to the Public Safety Training Center project, 27

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- and by replacing the Public Safety Training Center and DES Paramedic Station 2 Project Forms in the Fiscal
  Year 2025 Capital Budget with Attachments 1 and 2 respectively.
- 30 AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, that this 31 Bill shall take effect 60 calendar days from the date that it becomes law.

### **SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION**

**SPONSOR**: Council President at the request of the County Executive

BILL NO. 2024-17 – Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2025 Capital Improvement Program – Public Safety Training Center, Project Number 51030 and Paramedic Station #2, Project Number 50051

SYNOPSIS: A Bill to amend the Annual Budget and Appropriations Ordinance for Cecil County, Maryland, for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, to revise the funding sources for the Public Safety Training Center project, Project Number 51030 and Paramedic Station #2, Project Number 50051.

**FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARY:** The approval of this bill will have no impact on the fund balance.

#### **FISCAL ANALYSIS:**

The Public Safety Training Center project currently has \$7,250,000 in American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funds, but no County funds. ARPA funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by December 31, 2026. DPW recommends having a \$270,000 contingency fund for the Public Safety Training Center project. The contingency funds could be needed at any time during design and construction, which are expected to run thru December 2026. ARPA funds cannot be used for the contingency fund since they will be lost if not obligated by December 31, 2024; County funds need to be used since they don't have such a deadline. This bill proposes to swap out \$270,000 in ARPA funds from the Public Safety Training Center project for \$270,000 in County bond funds from the DES Paramedic Station 2 project, which has sufficient County funds available. There is no net change in the bottom-line funding for either project.

#### Project Description/Status:

After the recent range closures and scheduling difficulties at Elk Neck State Park Shooting Range, construction of a public safety training center in Cecil County is necessary to adequately train Sheriff's deputies and reduce operating and travel costs incurred by obtaining firearms training at outside facilities. Scheduling of range time has become increasingly difficult due to multiple agencies vying for time at fewer facilities. This project will construct an indoor range facility with 25-yard pistol and 50-yard rifle qualification lanes with movable targets, a classroom, administrative and mechanical space. The building will include provisions to control noise. The project will also provide required utilities, access roads, parking, and other supporting site improvements. The County has acquired the site. The project is currently in the planning phase.



#### Project Description/Status:

The current Paramedic Station #2 proposed location is located in leased space along Route 40 between North East and Elkton. This project will construct a new paramedic station along the Route 40 corridor in the vicinity of Charlestown to replace the leased space the current paramedic station utilizes and in a better location given projected future growth, call volumes, and response times. The paramedic station will include vehicle bays, office, bunk, and storage space. Water, sewer, and communications infrastructure will be extended to the site. Project is currently in land acquisitions and design phase
