- Meeting called to order at 8:00 am
- September 2024 Meeting minutes approved

### **Chairman's Report – Mike Ratchford**

- Alan Sexton of SWN passed away
  - Always attended EDC; great contributor to community; tremendous loss for SWN -- He will be missed
- Greater Baltimore Committee (GRC) presentation last week – hired firm to develop regional plan for economic growth in greater Baltimore regions (includes Cecil County)
- 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Cecil County – Oct. 21 time capsule ceremony

### **Director's Report – Bill Sorenson**

- Harvest Dinner tonight @ The Wellwood
- Cecil Grown ag magazine published – make sure to get a copy
- Oct. 9 – RAMP MD – Prototyping to Production Symposium, CONVERGE Innovation Center in Aberdeen
  - Tektonik, breakout from Fluoron group, displaying at symposium
- Oct. 21 – Time Capsule Ceremony for 350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Cecil County; to be opened in 50 years
- Greater Baltimore Committee (GBC) presented to audience in Cecil last week
  - Wanted to present to all jurisdictions in metropolitan statistical area (MSA)
  - Cecil not 100% in MSA but interested in what value could bring to Cecil
  - Requested GBC stay in touch with Bainbridge Development Corp and MD 5 Star
- Oct. 17-20 -- MD 5 Star
  - Ticket sales up 20+%; sponsorships up a bit
  - Oxford Firm performed Impact study on Cecil in 2023

- Total Room Nights: Estimated 11,750
- Total Room Nights for region (includes Delaware, DC, Philly): 16,950
- 73% of attendees from outside of State; 58% stayed overnight, 15% came for the day
- Federal, State, and Local government revenue generated \$3.7M; \$4.1M in total labor income in State of MD; \$5.3M regionally
- MD economy; \$5.3M generated regionally
- Approx. 30,000 total attendees in 2023

- Thank OED team for partnership with Commerce to achieve common goal of positive economic development in MD

  - Working with MD Economic Development Commission; hired consulting firm
  - Sent out survey, hosted focus groups with regional, industry, and economic development professionals
  - Developing pillars of focus and initiatives for next 5 years
  - Plan will require partnerships (MARBIDCO, TEDCO, MEDCO)
- Legislators may occasionally seek Dept. of Commerce input on bills specific to economic development
  - Commerce will review bills, comment addressing any concerns, can provide letter of information or letter of support/not support for General Assembly to consider
- Be engaged; be in touch with your legislators – important they hear from constituents not just during session
- Dept. of Commerce also working with Greater Baltimore Committee (GBC)
