**Synopsis:** A Resolution to support the transfer of Garrett Island from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the National Parks Service as a component of the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Historic Trail for the purpose of ensuring public access to this island and advancing regional economic development through partnership and heritage tourism.

**Explanation:** 

WHEREAS, the Lower Susquehanna Heritage Greenway, Inc. (LSHG) has been designated as the local management entity for the development of land and water based trails in the Lower Susquehanna Heritage Greenway since the year 2000; and, therefore, is proposing the island transfer, in accordance with locally and legislatively adopted plans; and

WHEREAS, the LSHG in partnership with our government, the Chesapeake Conservancy, The Conservation Fund, the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority, the Maryland Scenic Byway Program and the National Park Service have developed a series of comprehensive management plans for land and water trail development of state and national historic trails and byways in our jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Garrett Island formerly known as Palmer's Island, and later Watson Island, is 200 acres with the highest elevation being 80 feet is situated at the mouth of the Susquehanna River, which is one of the oldest rivers on earth and the longest non-navigable river in North America with drainage into the Atlantic Ocean; and

WHEREAS, Garrett Island is the only rocky island in the tidal waters of the Chesapeake Bay; King James I of England awarded Edward Palmer the island as part of a land grant in 1622; William Claiborne established the island as a trading post in 1637; and the Proprietary Government of Maryland ordered fortification on the island whereupon Fort Conquest was built in 1643; and

WHEREAS, Garrett Island was the first settlement in Cecil County and once home to John C. Paca, grandson of William B. Paca, a signer of the Declaration of Independence and a Maryland Governor; and WHEREAS, the US Department of the Interior was authorized to purchase Garrett Island as part of Blackwater National Wildlife Refuge to be managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in 2004, pursuant to 16 U.S.C. Section 668dd Public Law 108-131; and

WHEREAS, public access for boaters, paddlers, fishermen, campers, and explorers has been extremely limited to Garrett Island since it was transferred to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service; and WHEREAS, the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Historic Trail (Trail) was established by Congress in 2006 to commemorate John Smith's historic 3,000-mile voyages of discovery on land and water around the Chesapeake Bay; to help promote the conservation, public enjoyment, and appreciation of the Chesapeake watershed's rich natural and cultural history; and to provide for recreational opportunities along the Trail; and

29 WHEREAS, Garrett Island is a crucial component of the history of Captain Smith's exploration of the 30 Chesapeake Bay, and is believed to be the first site where Captain John Smith encountered and traded with the Susquehannock Indians in 1608, and 31 WHEREAS, Garrett Island can provide tremendous recreational, tourism, educational and cultural 32 benefits to the region because of its strategic location in Cecil and Harford Counties in Maryland, between 33 the waterfront communities of Perryville, Havre de Grace and Port Deposit; its association with John 34 Smith, the Susquehannock Indians and other important events in our national, state and local history; and 35 36 its outstanding sheltered waters, beach landings, and other recreational features; and WHEREAS, the Captain John Smith Chesapeake National Trail is to be administered by the National 37 Parks Service, pursuant to 16 U.S.C. Section 1244(a)(25)(C); and 38 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, 39 hereby urges the United States Congress and the Department of the Interior to take such actions as are 40 necessary to transfer Garrett Island and Battery Island to the National Park Service, designate and administer 41 the Trail as a "unit" of the National Park System, and reauthorize the Chesapeake Gateways program. 42 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, supports the 43 transfer of Garrett Island from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to the National Park Service to be managed 44 and interpreted as part of the Trail, with appropriate public access and stewardship of the Island and its 45 resources. 46 AND BE IF FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF CECIL COUNTY, MARYLAND, supports 47 the designation of the Trail as a Unit of the National Parks System and reauthorization of the Chesapeake Bay 48 Gateways and Water Trail Program as a program of the Trail. 49 50 AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this Resolution be sent to the Maryland General 51 Assembly and Governor of the State of Maryland, whereby requesting their endorsement. AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect on the date of its passage by the 52 County Council of Cecil County, Maryland 53 INTRODUCED: June 7, 2016
